Now to the results for round 7 and the final standings.

### **APBC 1 - Div 1**

#### **Albert Park 18/83 defeated City of Melbourne 0/17**

A fantastic win in all four games with each team winning their first game by more than 20 shots. How good is that? In my optimism about the Firsts having a shot at making it to the final four, I had not taken into account the fourth and fifth team meeting each other in round 7 to battle it out for fourth place. At the end, the Firsts ended up in fifth place on the ladder, only five points short of making it into fourth place.

### **APBC 2 - Div 3**

### **APBC 3 - Div 4**

### **APBC 4 - Div 5**
